## THE REMEDY

“Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money” (vs. 13) say instead...“If it is the Lord’s will, we will live and do this or that.” (vs. 15)

## THE POSTURES TOWARDS GOD’S WILL

1. You can reference God’s will: “I know I should go to worship...But I’m so tired. So, hello Pastor Pillow and hello Rev. Sheets!” Zzzzzz.
2. You can pay deference to God’s will: “I’m pretty tired but worship is important so let me observe a moment of silence and put on the Best of Hillsong Worship CD. What a beautiful name it is...”
3. You can give preference to God’s will: “I know I am tired but worship is a given and I need to go and be refueled and I need I need to go to refuel others. So up and att’em!”

## MISTAKE #2 \_\_\_\_\_ ABOUT TOMORROW

### TWO REASONS TO NOT PRESUME ABOUT TOMORROW

1. Life is too unpredictable.

“Why, you don’t even know what will happen tomorrow. (vs. 14a)

- 2, Life is fragile and temporal.

“What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes.” (vs. 14b)

“Come,” each one cries, ... Let us drink our fill of beer! And tomorrow will be like today, or even better!” Isaiah 56:12
